



Guyson Scottish Sprint and Hillclimb Championship Committee

Communiqué for Competitors No 1 – October 2008

### Introduction

Following comments raised at the meeting of the Committee on 12<sup>th</sup> October 2008 in Perth, it was agreed that a summary report of the meeting would be issued by the Chairman in an effort to keep registered competitors up to speed with what's happening. This is the first of these summaries and I hope it meets the needs – feedback is welcomed.

### Matters from July Meeting

Monklands still have issues with Class A7 at Forrestburn due to misalignment of dates – SSHC is 1.1.80. MSCC agreed to review inclusion of A7 class in addition to their "H" Classes to allow SSHC registered competitors to take part. (MSA also looking at some changes to period type modifications – waiting decision)

Lothian – Doune and British Championship classes – issue governed by Tony Fletcher and British Regs – possible change to Leaders classes for 2009. LCC committed to accommodate SSHC classes. Request that A9 and A10 be run after A8.

### New Business

**Sprint Bogey Times** – Concern raised by competitors re lack of clarity and consistency as to when times and bogeys are re-assessed and updated, particularly at double header events. Maximising points scoring doesn't always mean going fastest at venues. **Agreed that for 2009, no change to bogey on 2 day events using same track venue during that weekend.** All bogey time changes to be advised officially by Co-ordinator via email and web. Question of extra points for new sprint venues held over – nothing new planned for 2009. Grampian Automobile Club propose amending scoring system to always reward fastest time at Sprint venues – proposal to be fully worked through for circulation to Committee for discussion at next meeting – will not change before 2010 season.

**Entry Forms** - 2009's will have tick boxes for each championship.

**MSA Inter-Regional Challenge** - will be at Kames on 2<sup>nd</sup> August – title defence!

**2009 Sprints** - Meantime 17 events but East Fortune not definite – best 9 to count

**2009 Registration** – Single Fee of £20 – manual choice of Championship

**2010 Regulations** – Compliance with MSA Blue Book technical regulations will be mandatory – the Insurers are driving this requirement. Proposal for "Road Libre" class had mixed reception – already 20 Classes and do we need more? **Agreed to review number of affected Road Saloon and discuss further in January.**
